Isaiah 2:1-5

Message Summary

Jesus, the Son of God and light of the world, entered into our world and ascended a hill called Golgotha to die for our sin. Three days later, when all hope appeared lost, Christ was raised from the dead to shine light to all around him. The church, likewise, is to be a mountain of God's house, a city on a hill. We are to display the kingdom's beauty to draw people to the light.

Isaiah prophesies of just this day. People from every tribe and nation would be drawn to Jerusalem, the hill on which this city of light will be placed. Spears, instruments of war, will be beaten to plowshares, instruments of peace and human flourishing. Rather than fighting one another, the great diversity of humanity will live at peace with one another and their Creator, as it was in Eden. Christ substituted himself for us so that we can be part of His dream, His church.

Because these things will one day occur, "what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God" (2 Pt. 3:11)! Isaiah ends his vision by encouraging Israel (and, by implication, Christians today) to walk in the light of the Lord (v. 5).

How does a vision for the future flourishing in God's kingdom give dignity to all our work now?
