## Spiritual Memorial Day (Acts 14) Pastor Deric Thomas

[1] Now at Iconium they entered together into the Jewish synagogue and spoke in such a way that a great number of both Jews and Greeks believed. [2] But the unbelieving Jews stirred up the Gentiles and poisoned their minds against the brothers. [3] So they remained for a long time, speaking boldly for the Lord, who bore witness to the word of his grace, granting signs and wonders to be done by their hands. [4] But the people of the city were divided; some sided with the Jews and some with the apostles. [5] When an attempt was made by both Gentiles and Jews, with their rulers, to mistreat them and to stone them, [6] they learned of it and fled to Lystra and Derbe, cities of Lycaonia, and to the surrounding country, [7] and there they continued to preach the gospel. [8] Now at Lystra there was a man sitting who could not use his feet. He was crippled from birth and had never walked. [9] He listened to Paul speaking. And Paul, looking intently at him and seeing that he had faith to be made well, [10] said in a loud voice, "Stand upright on your feet." And he sprang up and began walking. [11] And when the crowds saw what Paul had done, they lifted up their voices, saying in Lycaonian, "The gods have come down to us in the likeness of men!" [12] Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul, Hermes, because he was the chief speaker. [13] And the priest of Zeus, whose temple was at the entrance to the city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates and wanted to offer sacrifice with the crowds. [14] But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their garments and rushed out into the crowd, crying out, [15] "Men, why are you doing these things? We also are men, of like nature with you, and we bring you good news, that you should turn from these vain things to a living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them. [16] In past generations he allowed all the nations to walk in their own ways. [17] Yet he did not leave himself without witness, for he did good by giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, satisfying your hearts with food and gladness." [18] Even with these words they scarcely restrained the people from offering sacrifice to them. [19] But Jews came from Antioch and Iconium, and having persuaded the crowds, they stoned Paul and dragged him out of the city, supposing that he was dead. [20] But when the disciples gathered about him, he rose up and entered the city, and on the next day he went on with Barnabas to Derbe. [21] When they had preached the gospel to that city and had made many disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, [22] strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God. [23] And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed. [24] Then they passed through Pisidia and came to Pamphylia. [25] And when they had spoken the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia, [26] and from there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work that they had fulfilled. [27] And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles. [28] And they remained no little time with the disciples. [Act 14:1-28 ESV]

- 1. Pray for God to help you grow in such a way that your gospel sharing, teaching, and preaching would become even more effective (1).
- 2. Don't let your mind be poisoned by the deception and lies of the evil one, even as he works through the gossip of people (2).
- 3. Just because their is resistance to your ministry doesn't mean you should give up on it (3).
- 4. The evil one will bring about division as a result of loving and truthful gospel preaching and teaching (4).
- 5. There are times when God will lead you to wisely flee certain situations in order to minister in other places and to other people (5-7).
- 6. God can heal anyone, at any time, and of anything, if He chooses (8-10).
- 7. Be careful of putting any person before God in your heart, even those He uses to serve and bless you the most (11-14).
- 8. God's life giving nature is so evidently good and loving. He graciously gives us relationships, food, clothing, shelter, comfort, and happiness (15-18)
- 9. No matter how bad things get when we are serving Christ, God can raise us up and make a way out of no way (19-20).
- 10. The missionary teams primary strategy was to preach the gospel, make disciples, appoint elders/pastors, strengthen the souls of disciples, follow up, and encourage them to persevere in faith through suffering (21-23).
- 11. Decisions about church leadership positions should be made with prayer and fasting, and fully committed to the Lord (23).
- 12. God uses healthy sending churches like Antioch in powerful ways to fulfill His work all over the world (24-26).
- 13. It is good to humbly share all that God graciously does through us as He opens doors of faith, and gives us opportunities to share with the church (27-28).
