## From: Jesus To: You... Learning to Pray (Luke 11:1-4) Dr. Deric Thomas

[1] Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." [2] And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. [3] Give us each day our daily bread, [4] and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation."

- 1. Talk to God personally, intimately, warmly, lovingly, as His children, as Father (<u>Abba</u>), through Jesus Christ.
- 2. Talk to God reverently, respectfully, and with <u>honor</u> since He is holy, set apart, and your awesome Creator.
- 3. Ask your holy Father for your basic everyday physical, spiritual, and relational needs because He wants you to look to Him for <u>everything</u>, and delights in providing for you.
- 4. Joyfully ask for and submit to God's loving <u>leadership</u> in your life through daily prayerful dependance.
- 5. Use "The Lord's Prayer" as a <u>model</u>, a framework, a basic outline for your personal prayer life, and as you teach others to pray.

[9] Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. [10] Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. [11] Give us this day our daily bread, [12] and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. [13] And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. [14] For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, [15] but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. [Matt. 6:9-15]

[18] Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of his inheritance? He does not retain his anger forever, because he delights in steadfast love. [19] He will again have compassion on us; he will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea. [Micah 7:18-19]
